#### **Basketball Victoria**

The governing body for basketball in Victoria and is responsible for operating the Victorian Junior Basketball League. Basketball Victoria also organises and operates development programs, talent identification camps, the state team program and participation programs such as Aussie Hoops and Hooptime.

#### **The VJBL Competition – Junior Steelers**

The Junior Steelers teams play on a Friday evening in the Victorian Junior Basketball League (VJBL). The VJBL is managed by Basketball Victoria, the peak body for basketball in Victoria, under Basketball Australia.

The competition includes the Victorian Championships (VC) and the Victorian Junior League (VJL). Teams in these competitions play at stadiums throughout the Greater Melbourne Metropolitan and Country Victoria.

Grading for the Competition begins in December and is broken into two parts – Phase 1in December. Teams are then regraded pending the results of Phase 1, then Grading Phase 2 is held throughout late January and February, before the season commences in March and finals are held at the end of September.

#### The Victorian Junior Basketball League (VJBL) Rules

The VJBL have several operational rules that the Association and participants must abide by. Later in this handbook, we have provided the Codes of Conduct for Parents and Players. Coaches also have Codes of Conduct they adhere too.

The VJBL Rules of Operations can be found on the Basketball Victoria website, along with competition dates and important information including:

- No Zone Information and Process for teams in U12 and U14 age groups
- Travel and Neutral Game Rule
- Hair and Hair Accessory Rule
- Protective Equipment Rule
- Concussion Policy and Protocols







#### **Behavioural Technical Foul Policy**

The VJBL has strict rules and regulations relating to referees and has implemented a Behavioural Tech Foul Policy. It is important to understand that gestures including facial expressions and body language if deemed as dissent by the game officials can penalised with a Technical Foul at the discretion of the referees.

Penalties because of Technical Fouls cannot be reversed or removed due to perceived harshness.

The following VJBL penalties are in place for repeated Technical Fouls:

First Technical Foul – no suspension

Second Technical Foul – 1 Game Suspension

Third Technical Foul - 2 Game Suspension\*

Fourth Technical Foul - 4 Game Suspension\*

Fifth & subsequent Technical Foul - 6 Game Suspension\*

Please Note: The Technical Foul count does not reset until the next season.

WPBA supports the stance of the VJBL. In addition to the penalties above, the following will occur at the Association level:

- \* After the third Technical Foul, the player/coach will be required to attend an internal hearing to discuss the situation and establish the player/coach's position within the Steelers Program
- Appeals although the VJBL has an appeals mechanism, WPBA will not appeal
  Technical Fouls that have been issued or penalties that have come from a Technical
  Foul unless an error has been made (ie. called on the wrong player) and there is video
  evidence to prove an error occurred. Each Technical Foul appealed has a nonrefundable \$75 fee that will be charged to the player or coach. This fee includes the
  VJBL fee that is charged to the Association and must be paid before the appeal is
  lodged to the VJBL.







#### **The Big V Competition – Senior Steelers**

The Senior Steelers teams compete in the Big V Competition. Western Port fields senior teams in the Open Men, Open Women, Youth League Men and Youth Women Competitions. This season runs from April to September with home games being held each Saturday night or Sunday afternoon during the season.

#### **Western Port Player Pathway**

Junior Representative Basketball begins with Under 12s and continues up to Big V and beyond. Our current player pathway is denoted below:







#### **Playing Representative Level Basketball**

When representing WPBA as a Steeler, it is important that each player and parent understand that the playing standard is much higher and stronger than local domestic competitions. The "VJBL" is the highest league for junior basketball.

Our representative teams will compete against some of the best individuals and teams from throughout Victoria e.g. Dandenong Rangers, Knox Raiders, Nunawading Spectres, Melbourne Tigers to name a few of the familiar clubs.

All Associations go through a grading period to ensure teams are placed in their correct level of competition. The "Grading Phase" include:

- Spring Phase Commences end October, practice games for Associations.
- Pre-Grading Games to determine team's entry level if the league is unsure.
- 1st Grading Phase Commences November: Consists of three rounds of games as well as crossover games and any challenge game that may be required.
- 2nd Grading Phase Commences end January. Consists of three rounds of games as well as crossover games and any challenge game that may be required.

Each phase is a process that teams must play to determine their correct level of entry. After the completion of the 2nd Grading Phase, all teams will commence their season.

Teams may also compete in different tournaments held throughout the year. These tournaments are not compulsory and are up to the individual team and their coaching staff to determine if they participate.

Some of the tournaments include the Eltham-Dandenong Tournament (Australia Day), Ballarat Tournament (Kings Birthday), Nunawading Tournament (Kings Birthday).







#### **Parent/Carer Commitment**

Please support the whole team during games and trainings, not just your son or daughter. The coach is to be the only source of technical feedback to the players. Coaching from the sidelines is never appropriate regardless of your knowledge of Basketball. This practice confuses players.

Parents/Carers also need to be careful about discussing team issues in front of their children. If you speak negatively about a coach, player or referee, your child may adopt the same negative attitude. We are looking for positive players and positive support from parents.

We do encourage you to be vocal in your support of our teams. However, do not make negative comments about the opposition, the referees or other team members. Parents/Carers must also understand that coaches are given the task of making objective decisions in regard to your son or daughter with respect to what is best for the team and club. We do understand that there will be some contentious decisions.

Effective communication between the coach and you is the key to addressing any issues you may have with the coach's decision. If you have positive feedback this can be brought up at any time. However, if you have issues that need resolving then please follow the appropriate process by contacting the Head of Coaching Committee (HOCC) by email – hocc@wpba.com.au

Please Note: WPBA operate with a "Cool Off" period for 24 hours after a game. This means parents/carers cannot contact the coach of their sons or daughters' team for at least 24 hours after a game. For example: if there is a game played on a Friday evening the coach should not be contacted until the team training on the following Sunday morning.







#### **Costs and Fees**

Representative Fees do not cover all costs associated with the representative program. WPBA subsidises the program to ensure fees are kept as affordable as possible.

The fee in 2025 will be \$675. This fee covers all Basketball Victoria entry and administration fees, 2 training sessions per week (previously one), all administration and coaching and the presentation and end of season awards.

The fee doesn't cover additional training sessions, uniforms or additional tournaments and related expenses that the team chooses to compete in.

The fee payment schedule and key dates are as follows:

Non-Payment of Fee's – The assumption is that all fee's will be paid by the allotted due date. A "No Pay, No Play" policy will apply. Should payment not be received by the specified due date, WPBA will remind individuals by emailing a statement to the nominated email address of the individual.

If payment is still not received within 14 days, the player will be deemed 'unfinancial' and maybe suspended from all domestic and representative fixtures.

Sibling Discount – A sibling discount is available to families with more than one representative player. A reduction of \$25 is available for the second player and a \$50 discount for the third and subsequent siblings.

The fee schedule for RDL athletes will differ and can be obtained by contacting the office.

#### **Fee Payment Schedule**

Selected players will receive an email inviting them a place within the Steelers Program. To accept the invitation, players will need to register using this link. At this time, a deposit of \$50 will need to be paid.

Once accepted, WPBA will invoice each family for their fees.

There are different options for payment (all payments are made via the invoice provided):

- 1. Payment of all fees up front;
- 2. Payment of fees in instalments. This process is handled through our partner EziDebit. EziDebit enables families to arrange a direct debit arrangement that is more flexible. Please Note: there are additional transaction fees for this service.

Payments can be made in a number of different ways:

- Eftpos in the office or over the phone via a Credit or Debit Card
- Online using PayPal, or a Credit or Debit Card
- Direct Bank Deposit into our account (using your invoice number as the reference) Unfortunately, we are unable to accept payments by cash.

**Financial Hardship** – Requests for fee relief due to genuine financial hardship should be sent to the General Manager by the participant (if under 18 years of age, the parent of the participant). Any requests for fee relief will be dealt with in confidence and on a case-by-case basis.

**Players Withdrawing** – A commitment for a player is for the ENTIRE season irrespective of later motivation. While fee reduction may be considered on a case-by-case basis in the event of serious injury or relocation, fee reductions are assessed upon application.

**Local Competition Fine** – All junior representative players are required to play in the WPBA Winter Domestic Competition. Players will be deemed to have taken part in the Domestic Competition by participating in at least 50% of games.

If there is a legitimate reason a player cannot fulfill this commitment, they will need to apply in writing to the General Manager for an exemption. Penalties for non-compliance may include a fine of \$250 or player suspension.







#### **Registration and Uniform Session**

When players are selected, they will receive an email. Please ensure you check your SPAM or Junk folders. If you do not receive an email, please contact us via email to <a href="mailto:office@wpba.com.au">office@wpba.com.au</a> (do not call) and we will investigate.

The email will contain a link to register and confirm your acceptance into the program. A deposit (instalment 1) of \$50 will need to be paid and families will be given the opportunity to purchase a Player Pack containing a Backpack, Socks and Drink Bottle.


This is compulsory for new players to the Steelers program.

Players must confirm their spot in the program otherwise it may be offered to another player. Ordering for uniforms needs to be done online.

In 2025, we have a new supplier – Athlead. This will mean a change to how orders are placed (online only) and delivered to either our office or to your door.






#### **Singlet Numbers**

When participating in the uniform fitting, available singlet numbers will be available to choose from. Please speak to our staff members or volunteers on duty to reserve a number. Once confirmed, the number will be allocated to you.

When ordering your uniform, please enter the singlet number that was allocated to you. This is then cross referenced by Athlead and approved by the WPBA prior to production of uniforms.



**Unform fittings** can be undertaken at the Uniform Fitting Day Sunday, 27th of October, or via appointment at the WPBA Office.







#### **Conflict Resolution**

When a situation occurs that raises concern (pertaining to all matters EXCEPT playing time, game strategy, or issues concerning other players), we ask that this process is followed to resolve the situation:

- Encourage the player to seek out his/her coach in a private meeting.
- Arrange a meeting with the coach.
- Arrange a meeting with the Steelers Head of Coaching Committee (HOCC)
- Arrange a meeting with the Junior Representative Committee (JRC).

The content of these discussions will be kept confidential.

Parents are not to contact the VJBL directly.

#### **Team/Player Photos**

WPBA will conduct a player and team photo session all players, coaches and managers will be required to attend. These photos are taken by professional photographers.

Team photos have been booked for 2nd of March 2025.

#### How to get involved

There are various ways players and parents can further help the club. Volunteers are required for the following important functions:

- Team Manager;
- Assistant Coach;
- Big V set up and pack up each team will be on a roster, but many parents assist at all home games;
- Become a Referee players can learn more about the game and earn some money;
- Become a Sponsor Perhaps your company can help by supporting a team;
- Sub-Committees Parents can help by joining one of the sub-committees that help with the running of the Association.

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person.
- Be prepared to lose sometimes.
- Listen to the advice of your coach and try to apply it at practice and in games.
- Always respect the use of facilities and equipment provided.
- Never disrespect your Association, teammates or opposition on social media.

#### **Parents Code of Conduct**

- Encourage children to participate for their own interest and enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage children to always play by the rules.
- Teach children that an honest effort is always as important as victory.
- Focus on developing skills and playing the game and less on winning.
- A child learns best by example.
